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Little Explorers – Ages 3 & 4

Children are natural explorers! Each week we will explore art, science, nature and cooking. We will learn through hands-on activities and play.

Instructor: This is **Megan Zimmerman**'s fourth year teaching preschool and second year at Roeper. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education and is currently pursuing her Master of Education in Early Childhood Education. She teaches Cooking Enrichment for Stage I at Roeper.

Note: Children must be fully potty-trained.

Dinosaurs! Dinosaurs! Dinosaurs! - Ages 4-6

We are going to have so much fun learning about different types of dinosaurs and how they lived millions of years ago! Students will do art projects, go on dinosaur hunts, read books, and many more fun, interactive activities focused on dinosaurs. If children have questions or ideas, we will research these and come up with our answers together. Come one, come all, and let the dinosaur fun begin!

Instructor: This is **Sarah Smith**'s ninth year working at The Roeper School where she's loved teaching Stage II (K/1) children for the last six years. She also serves as the Substitute Teaching Coordinator for both campuses. Sarah earned her M.A.Ed. from Oakland University and a B.A. in Elementary Education and English Literature from Adrian College. Prior to working at Roeper, Sarah taught kindergarten at a charter school for four years.

Leave No Trace – Ages 7-8

Are you passionate about our world? Are you interested in our environment? Are you curious to learn how you can leave nature as you found it? What if you could learn strategies for taking care of the Earth and for leaving it better than you found it? This class will explore your passions and strategies to care for our planet through the Seven Principles of The Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics. Many outdoor explorers like you are learning to use these tools when they spend time in nature — from the backcountry, to local parks, to your

backyard! The strategies we will learn about can be used anywhere! Join us when we discover how to make a world of difference!

Instructor: **Jensen Sprowl** has been a Roeper teacher for two years. She Teaches Stage III (2/3). Jensen grew up in rural Michigan and has spent much of her life outdoors. From a young age, she has found peace and friends in nature. While attending Kalamazoo College, Jensen coorganized and led wilderness expeditions for schoolmates and friends. During these trips, Jensen saw the value of The Leave No Trace Seven Principles firsthand and became passionate about sharing what she had learned with others.

Nature Poetry – Ages 9-11

Get on your boots, your coat and hat — this is a writing class that moves! In Nature Poetry we will begin each class learning a poetry form; after the introduction we will take to the woods and other beautiful areas that surround our campus to look for inspiration. Students will then write using the introduced format or one of their own to capture the picture that they see with their words. Each week we will spend time sharing our work, and coming up with ways to enhance our creations using writing tools such as figurative language and artistry tools like paints.

By the end of our four classes each member of the group will take home a book of their own works as well as a better appreciation for nature and the beauty of their words.

Instructor: **Laura Evans** has been teaching for 15 years, most of which has been spent teaching Humanities. Laura loves nature and sharing her appreciation for the outdoors with students.

Computer Programming I – Ages 7-8

The children in this class will explore *Scratch*. They will explore how the various commands work and how to use them to design graphics and basic computer games. They will use the language to control a Finch robot.

Instructor: **Julie Nemchik** has loved teaching computer classes at The Roeper School for 21 years. She has an M.A.T. in Elementary Education and is a member of the Michigan Association of Computer Users in Learning (MACUL). She is married with two grown children and two cats and loves playing and watching sports.

Computer Programming II – Ages 9-11

The children in this class will learn the basics of the LOGO programming language using a program called *Microworlds*. They will explore how the various commands work and how to use them to design graphics and basic computer games. The children will program their own version of *Pacman*.

Instructor: **Paula Romano** has been teaching computer classes at The Roeper School for 21 years. She has a B.A. in both Physical Health Education and Elementary Education as well as an M.A. in Exercise Science. She has two children, both Roeper alumni (2011 and 2013).

Art Discovery – Ages 9-12

Through playful, creative problem-solving activities, students will have the opportunity to explore various art media. Printmaking, bookmaking, painting, drawing and sculpture will be taught. Each young artist will experience the joy of discovering and celebrating their uniqueness through art. No prior art making experience is necessary.

Instructor: **Tessa Stein** graduated with a B.A. degree in Ceramics from the Johannesburg College of Art in South Africa. For 30 years she has been working as a ceramic artist and educator. She has traveled extensively, working as a production potter in various countries. She has an extensive teaching background, and the majority of her teaching experience has been as a resident artist in over 50 schools. She has worked at The Roeper School since 2009.

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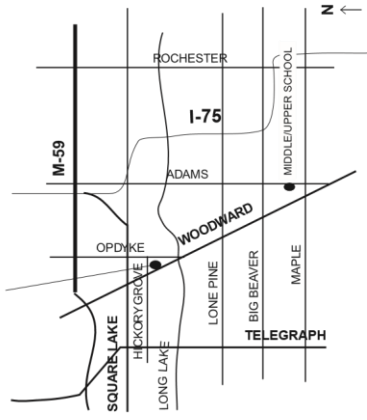
